Studies of disturbance effects on another subspecies of *Felis concolor* in Arizona and Utah found that resident mountain lions altered their home range and home area to avoid logging activity and logged areas (Van Dyke 1983; Van Dyke et al. 1986). Further, the mountain lions altered their activity patterns to avoid human contact by shifting their peak activity to periods of darkness and avoiding the normal peaks of dawn and dusk. Lions appeared to select home ranges where timber sale areas were absent, road densities were lower than average, and there were few or no permanent human disturbance sites, such as residences. The study concluded: First, areas that experience permanent or repeated habitat alteration are reduced in quality to the lion population, even if human residence, presence, or activity is...
