By way of preface, it may be stated that the glorious summer of 1905 passed away with the passing of July, and that, unlike the preceding three months, August proved for the most part very unsettled, rainy, and cool. The disturbances which reached our shores from the Atlantic were numerous, but, as a rule, of no great intensity, so that they brought wet weather rather than wind-storms. In the Monthly Weather Report of the Meteorological Office for August it is stated that the rainfall was above the average at three-fourths of the stations in Great Britain, and at nearly every station in Ireland, the excess at some western stations being between 2 inches and 4 inches.
